Description:

This 6 session professional enrichment course will introduce students to the field of Emergency Medicine and various sub-specialties with an emphasis on emergent care of the critically ill or injured patient. This noon-time lecture series is sponsored by the Emergency Medicine Student Association and will cover various topics relevant to Emergency Medicine and various emergency situations. Topics will include an introduction to complex clinical cases, gun violence, trauma management, child maltreatment, toxicology and In-flight emergencies. Lectures include pathophysiology and clinical correlation. The lecturers are all boardcertified faculty members or fellows within the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center.

Objectives:

- To provide framework of skills needed in the care of the critically ill or injured patient and various emergency situations.
- To expose students to the field of EM and provide information on the wide range of practice opportunities and sub-specialties available.
- To provide a foundation to apply pathophysiology to actual clinical cases.
- To provide practical knowledge of emergency scenarios relevant to Emergency Medicine but applicable to a diverse range of medical specialties.

Session 1 – Tuesday, September 24, 2024

Complex patient care Dr. Stephanie Gonzalez, MD

Medical decision making isn't as simple as making a diagnosis and prescribing treatment. Using actual clinical cases, we will walk through the complex issues affecting patient care in the Emergency Department. The focus will be on social and economic factors that impact access to care and the how decision making is altered based on individual patient needs.

Session 2 – Tuesday, October 8, 2024

Gun Violence

Dr. Raquel Forsyth, MD

Guns killed over 45,000 Americans in 2021. Since 9/11, only 549 Americans have died from terrorism. But yet only \$25 million is budgeted toward gun violence compared to the \$8 trillion spent on the war on terror. In this lecture, we will discuss gun violence as one of the largest public health problems int his country and what you can do about it.

Session 3- Tuesday, November 12, 2024

"Is There a Doctor on Board? Medical Emergencies at 30,000 Feet"

"Ladies and gentlemen: is there a doctor on board?" We will use recordings of real-life in-flight emergency consults to supplement a discussion of common and uncommon scenarios that medical providers maybe challenged with during commercial airline travel. We will discuss the unique aspects of patient care inthis austere environment, what supplies and resources are available, the medical challenges of taking care of patients at altitude, considerations for aircraft diversion, and how you can help.

Session 4- Tuesday, January 7, 2025

Child Maltreatment Dr. Jennifer Wolford, DO

Participants will have an understanding of the scope of the problem of child maltreatment and will become more familiar with legal aspects and the child protection system. Students will also gain insight into ways abused and neglected children present in the ED setting.

Session 5-Tuesday, March 4, 2025

Trauma Management Dr. Christina Leeper, MD

Learn about initial management principles of trauma patients. The focus of the lecture will be actual case studies of trauma patients focusing on mechanism of injury, anatomy and physical findings, diagnostic evaluation and clinical decision making.

Session 6- Tuesday, April 22, 2025

An Introduction to Toxicology Michael Abesamis, MD This talk with introduce students to the field of Toxicology including scope of practice and conditions managed within the specialty. Clinical presentation, pathophysiology, management and outcomes will be discussed in the context of actual cases.
